She was inducted into the Ohio Wesleyan Athletics Hall of Fame in 2002 and was the first woman to receive the George Gauthier Award in 2021 which recognizes graduates of Ohio Wesleyan for exemplary "service above self" and sustained contributions to the Ohio Wesleyan athletics department as both an undergraduate and alumnus. Catie also served as chair of the 2024 WOW Leadership Committee.
